Early Language

It is challenging to learn a new language, but toddlers are up to the task. Language is developed through an understanding of a language's sound system, words, and grammar. By the age of five, children master the sound system and grammar of their language, and have a vocabulary of thousands of words. How quickly they arrive at the finish line varies, but they all take the same path: (1) early cries; (2) consonant and vowel combinations; (3) repetitions of syllables or babbling; and (4) first words.
